**82<sup>d</sup> Airborne Division**  
"Sicily, 1943"
5. What was in the suitcase that the Jedburghs carried during their missions?  
**Radio**  
"Jedburgh Operations in France"
6. Describe the relative location of the glider.  
Answers may vary, but might include **between the Pacific Theater and Cold War Exhibits, in the WWII area**, etc.
7. List two personal items found in the Ground Mobility Vehicle (GMV) in the Global War on Terrorism exhibit. Do any of the items surprise you?  
**Items include: baseball cap, pictures of kids, toy GMV, Gatorade, Skittles, coffee maker, Pringles, etc.**  
Look near "ARSOF in Iraq: Victory in the North and West"
8. After seeing objects such as the Riddell Parachutist Helmet, Jedburgh suitcase, and glider, how has the technology used in warfare changed since the 1940's?  
**Answers will vary, but might include: communication equipment is smaller and more precise; safety equipment is stronger and lighter, etc.**

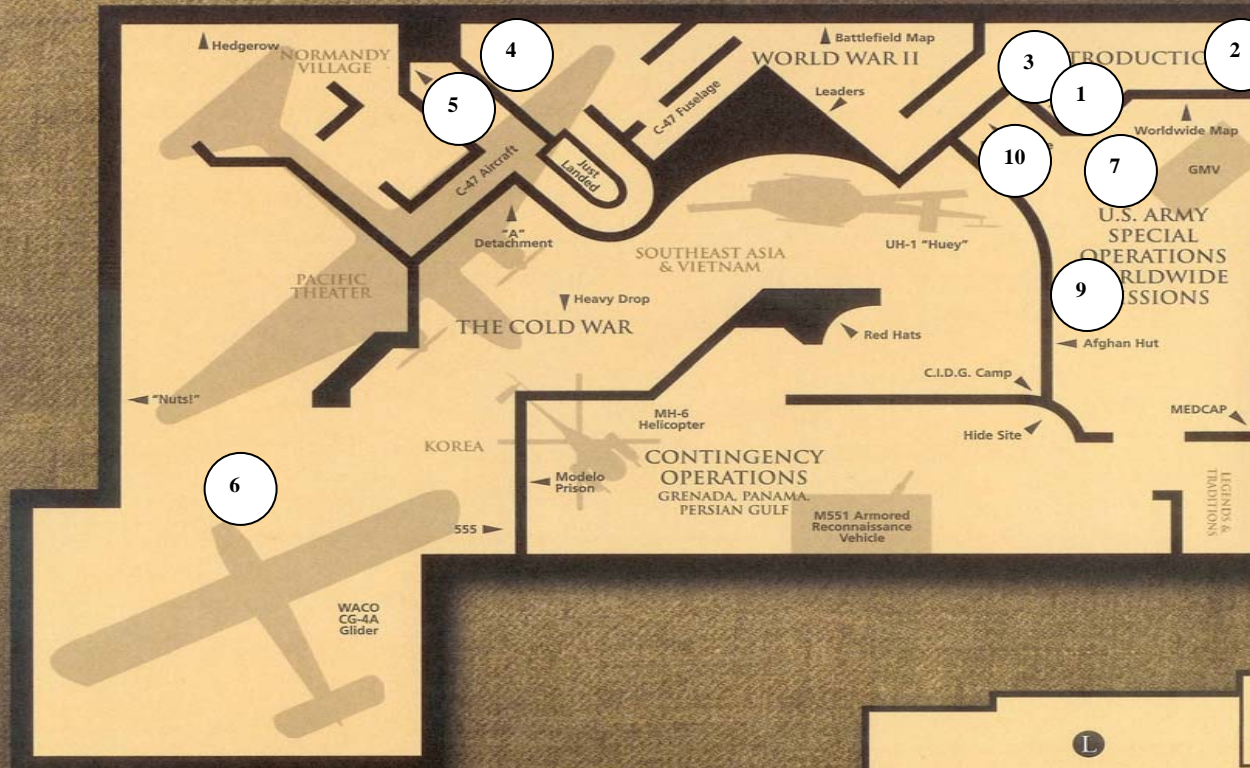
